Depart your home city for London, England.

Day 2 | November 29

London, England | Bath

Arrive in London, transfer to Bath and check in to *The Francis Hotel*. If you wish, venture out to visit the Georgian-style Bath Christmas Market, filled with carol singers and chalets selling local foods. Gather later for a Welcome Reception.

Day 3 | November 30

B-L

Bath

Trace history while walking through well-preserved Bath, nestled along the River Avon. Visit the Roman Baths, where you can view artifacts dedicated to the healing goddess Sulis and the remains of an ancient heating system. Next, admire the must-see highlights of Bath Abbey, a magnificent Gothic church, and Pulteney Bridge, an 18th-century masterpiece. Enjoy a private tour of the

Georgian Royal Crescent, a row of houses with Georgian façades and Romanesque columns.

Delight in a Christmas-themed Afternoon Tea. Savor indulgent finger sandwiches, exquisite cakes and pastries, handmade scones served with clotted cream and jam, and fine loose tea or coffee.

Cap off the day with leisure time to craft your own path.

Day 4 | December 1

B-L

Bath | Lacock

Travel to breathtaking rural England to the charming Cotswolds. Begin at the quaint village of Lacock, managed by

the National Trust. Stroll along Lacock's high street, visit Lacock Abbey and listen to stories of scientist William Henry Fox Talbot. Many films and TV shows have been filmed here, including "Pride and Prejudice" and the beloved "Downton Abbey."

Enjoy lunch at the White Hart, a traditional English pub.

En route to Bath, stop at the National Trust Dyrham Park, a 270-acre park with an elegant country house. The rooms sparkle with festive greenery and twinkling lights, creating a warm holiday glow, while outside, a magnificent

Dinner is at leisure tonight. Find a traditional holiday meal with roast turkey Yorkshire puddings, roasted vegetables or mince pies.

Day 5 | December 2 **B**

Bath | London

After breakfast, depart for London. Your first adventure in this dynamic city begins at the renowned Victoria & Albert Museum (V&A). Founded in 1857, the V&A houses an extraordinary collection that spans centuries — from exquisite fashion and medieval tombs to luxurious Persian silk carpets. See the first

Christmas card, requested by Sir Henry Cole and designed by artist John Callcott Horsley in 1843.

Check in to the elegant *The Rubens at the Palace*.

Day 6 | December 3 **B-L**

London

Delve into the life of world-famous author Charles Dickens on an enlightening walking tour. Begin at the Charles Dickens Museum and join a guide to tour the museum's rare paintings, manuscripts and more. Then, follow a storied path, from alleyways to gas-lit courtyards and old pubs, plus other sites that Dickens knew intimately and wrote about. Learn about the background behind different novels and

interesting facts about Dickens' life and works.

Settle in for a traditional English pub lunch at the historic Ye Olde Cheshire Cheese, where crackling fires, hearty fare and centuries of London lore create the perfect setting.

Continue to the dazzling Leadenhall Market, a stunning covered arcade with an ornate Victorian interior. During the festive season, it transforms into a holiday wonderland, adorned with twinkling lights, miniature Christmas trees, sweeping garlands and a magnificent centerpiece tree. Browse the boutiques and food spaces, which offer mulled wines, baked goods and a selection of gifts.

Day 7 | December 4 **B-D**

Windsor | London

Experience the grandeur of Windsor Castle, one of His Majesty the King’s official residences and a magnificent setting for royal ceremonies and state occasions. Explore the opulent State Apartments, home to world-class art collections, and marvel at the festive décor — including a towering Nordmann Fir tree in St. George’s Chapel.

Back in London, Ebenezer Scrooge and his three ghosts take center stage tonight

during a performance of “A Christmas Carol” at London’s famous Old Vic theater. Enjoy dinner before the show.

Day 8 | December 5 **B-L**

London

After breakfast, join your selected Traveler’s Choice excursion. Either participate in a Christmas-themed cooking class or visit Covent Garden, a beloved Christmas destination.

Hop on an open-top bus to enjoy a drive along London’s
